RALLS COUNTY MISSOURI
and some "Firsts"

The compiler of these records is not attempting to write a history of Ralls County, but since many names listed in the early records may be found at an earlier date in the records of Pike County from which it was cut Nov. 16, 1820- and, since many names listed in our Ralls County records will at a later date be found in the counties cut from Ralls, the searcher of Family records must know the "breakdown" of various early counties of Missouri.

In 1763 France ceded this territory (of which our Ralls was a part) to Spain, but in 1800 it was re-ceded to France. Thomas Jefferson, when President, was unwilling that France should command the Mississippi or control the Gulf, thus endangering American Commerce, and entered into negotiations for the great "Louisiana Purchase" completed in 1803.

Although nominally under the jurisdiction of France during this period, 1800-1803, Louisiana was governed by Spanish laws. Many of the early grants in this county are "Spanish Grants".

Our Congress made Louisiana into two territories, one the territory of "Orleans", the other the "District of Louisiana", known as "Upper Louisiana" and embracing the present state of Missouri. In 1805, Congress converted the District of Louisiana into the Territory of Louisiana with a government of its own.

That part of Missouri which was then settled was divided for local government into four districts; Cape Girardeau, St. Genevieve, St. Louis and St. Charles, the latter including the territory between the Missouri and Mississippi Rivers, which of course embraced the present county of Ralls. This continued until 1812 when the Territory of Louisiana was organized as the Territory of Missouri with William Clark as Governor.

On Oct. 1st, 1812, Gov. Clark issued a proclamation reorganizing the districts of St. Charles, St. Louis, St. Genevieve, Cape Girardeau and New Madrid into five counties. You will note by this that all of Northeast Missouri was in St. Charles County; but Lincoln and Pike were created from St. Charles on Dec. 14, 1818, and our Ralls was then a part of Pike.

When Pike County was organized in 1818 it composed all of the present Pike, nearly all of Audrain, part of

Randolph, Macon, Adair and Schuyler, and all of Ralls, Marion, Monroe, Shelby, Lewis, Knox, Clark and Scotland.

It has four original Townships, Mason, Peno, Buffalo and Calumet at a time when what is now Ralls formed parts of several of these townships on the North. All the land lying north of Salt River was known as Mason. However, when Ralls was set up as a separate county, Mason Township, left in Pike became Pike's Salt River Township.

Ralls County was cut from Pike Nov. 16, 1820 and stretched north to the Iowa line and west between ranges 13 and 14 and comprising the territory now forming Audrain, Monroe, Marion, Shelby, Lewis, Clark, Knox, and Scotland, and the east sides of Randolph, Macon, Adair and Schuyler counties. Marion was taken from the northern part of Ralls in 1826; Randolph was organized in 1829 taking a strip six miles wide from the west. Monroe cut from Ralls in 1831, and Audrain in 1830 when Ralls assumed its present shape and limits. Lewis County was taken from Marion in 1833. Shelby was organized in 1835 and in 1843 a part of Monroe was added. Clark county was first organized in 1818, but re-organized in 1836 when it was taken from Lewis. Scotland was taken from Lewis in 1841, and Knox from Scotland in 1845. A portion of Monroe was added to Audrain in 1842. Thus, many of the earlier settlers of these counties were at one time settlers and pioneers of Ralls County.

Ralls County was named for Daniel Ralls "a member of the Legislature from Pike County, who died in 1820 while the legislature was in session, and whose casting vote elected Col. Benton to the United States Senate"; the Act of Nov. 16, 1820, forming the county of Ralls, designated Dabney Jones, James Garnett, Richard Jones, Stephen Glascock and Francis Grant as Commissioners to locate the county seat and New London was chosen.

The 1st Circuit Court of the new county was held at the home of William Janeson (the founder of the town) on the 18th of March, 1821, and the 1st County Court on the 2nd day of April of that year at the same place. Col. Peter Journey and William Ritchie were sworn in as Justices of the County Court. Stephen Glascock was the first clerk.

The 1st recorded meeting is dated April term 1821; the 2nd meeting was recorded July 2, 1821 when the Court met again and "Peter Journey, Peter Grant and William Ritchie, gents, Justices of the County Court; Green DeWitt, Sheriff of Ralls County; and Stephen Glascock, Clerk; all produced commissions from Alexander McNair, Governor of the State of Missouri. Green DeWitt was selected as the

first Collector and the county was laid off into Municipal townships. Of these four were defined, viz: Spencer, Salt River, Mason and Liberty.

Spencer Tsp. commenced on the Mississippi River at the northeast corner of Ralls County, as now defined, extending west on the line between Townships 56 and 57, to where the toll-gate, next to Hannibal on the Paris gravel road is now located: (i.e. 1878. N.D.N.) thence south on the line between Ranges 4 & 5, striking Salt River about one-half mile east of where the bridge stands; thence west with the river to the middle of Range 6 W., thence South to the north line of Montgomery County; thence east with the Montgomery line to the Mississippi River, with the river to the place of beginning.

Salt River Twsp. embraced the territory west of Spencer, reaching to Charlton County.

Mason was a long strip beginning on the Mississippi at the east end of the line between Townships 57 and 58 and running west with this line to the line between Ranges 6 & 7, thence dropping south six miles to the line between Townships 57 & 57, thence running west to Range 14, thence south 6 miles to the northwest corner of Salt River Township, embracing the territory immediately north of Salt River and Spence Townships.

Liberty embraced all the territory north of Mason, stretching to the south line of Iowa. A large township, since it took in all of what is Shelby, Lewis, Clark, Scotland and Knox Counties, nearly all of Marion, and the eastern portions of Macon, Adair and Schuyler.

Daniel Smith was appointed Constable of Spencer; Matthew Eubanks, of Salt River; William McRae, of Mason; and Lewis Vanlandingham, of Liberty. Clement White was appointed Assessor.

The 1st Ralls County Missouri Record Book is dated July 2, 1821 to August 15, 1837 -. The County Court was held at the home of William Jameson until August 12, 1822 at which date the meeting was begun at his home and adjourned to the new Court House for the continuation of this meeting. This was a log structure about 24' X 18' located in the Western part of town, on the second block west of where the court house now stands. (This land was afterwards part of the home lot of my grandfather, George Campbell Hays, Jr., and is at this time owned by a descendant, N.D.R.) The building was two stories high, the upper-story being the court room and the lower story the jail, this divided into two apartments, one of which was a dungeon.

This Court House was replaced in 1835 by a brick building two stories high, about 50' square, furnishing quite a commodious court room on the ground with a brick floor, the Clerk's offices and jury rooms being upstairs. From defective construction or material, this building became unsafe, and was torn down in 1858 and the present house erected. A new jail was built in 1842, and again in 1869. Our present Court House - built in 1858 - is one of the finest specimens of 1850 architecture in the state of Missouri, and a replica was used by our State for the Missouri Buildings at the late World Fairs held in New York and in San Francisco.

The 1st Circuit Court met the 18th day of March, 1821, Hon. Rufus Pettibone, Judge; Green DeWitt, Sheriff; and Stephen Glascock, Clerk. The first grand jury was composed of:

*Jacob Seely (Seeley) died in 1823 and an Administrator was appointed Dec. 10, 1823. According to the original estate papers in File #1073 in the Ralls Co., Mo., Probate Office, Jacob Seeley and Wm. W. Smith owned in partnership a Keel Boat called the "Maid of New London". There is a "Statement of the Expenses of the Keel Boat Maid of New London" dated Aug. 23, 1823 showing the amount "Smith paid out" and the amount "Mr. Seeley paid out". One item was for "use of steers". These papers also showed "The half of Keel Boat sold at \$118.00". Another interesting paper in this old file, yellow with age, but quite legible (1944) is -- "New London

23rd Aug 1823

To the Post Master General

Sir

I will carry the mail from St. Charles to Palmyra as stated in the proposals for Seven Hundred and fifty Dollars Pr year".

Our early State Senators were: Stephen Glascock, 1838; William Priest, 1846; William Newland, 1858 & also in 1872; Columbus F. Kirtley, 1874.

According to the Missouri Blue Book of 1915-1916, William Briggs represented Ralls in the First Gen. Assembly, 1820.

Stephen Glascock was Circuit Clerk, County Clerk and Recorder of Deeds 1821-1828; Charles Glascock, 1828-1837; Harrison Glascock, 1837-1838; and John Ralls, 1838-1848. In 1848 the offices of Circuit Clerk and County Clerk were separated. From which time Samuel K. Caldwell was Circuit Clerk and Recorder until 1865, when he was ousted by Drake Constitution and Reuben St. John was appointed to fill the unexpired term. In 1866 Samuel K. Caldwell was again elected and held the place until his death in August 1868. (There is a beautiful memorial or resolution on the books of the Circuit Clerk to Mr. Caldwell by the members of the Court and Bar at the August term 1868. NDN). Mr. Eli W. Southworth was then appointed to fill the vacancy until Jan. 1st, 1871. At the November election in 1870 James W. Lear was elected to and still holds both offices (1878. NDN).

In 1848 William O. Young was County Clerk and filled the office until he was declared insane March 12, 1858 when Oliver H.P. Ledford was appointed. August 1858 James W. Lear was elected and held the place until March 1862 .. Albert G. Lancaster held the position until Autumn of 1866 when Geo. E. Mayhall was elected. In 1874 William B. Stevens was elected.

Judges of the County Court

The first three were Peter Journey; Peter Grant and William Ritchie, and when Judge Journey was elected to the Legislature in 1822, Samuel Lippincott took his place on the bench. Then: Elijah Stapp; John Longmire; John Chitwood; Lewellen Porter; Hugh Muldrow; John Barton; Daniel Hendrick; Walter Caldwell; Andrew Rogers; Richard Boyce; William Foreman; French Glascock; William S. Lofland; Dabney Jones; Stephen McPherson; Tyre A. Haden; Daniel B. Kendrick; Chapel Carstarphen; Geo. L. Hardy; Francis S. Stout; Landie Fagan; Nathan S. Cimmitt; Benjamin Ely; James S. Dimmitt; John D. Briggs; William E. Harris; Lewis C. Northcutt; Nimrod Waters; Joseph Buchanan; Samuel Megown; Rev. Wm. Priest; James H. Underwood; James L. Ball; with Judges Priest, Underwood and Bell the incumbents in 1878.

From 1824 until 1827, there was a separate Probate Court, Stephen Glascock, Judge. The Probate Court was abolished in 1827 and probate matters given to the County Court where it remained until 1866. In 1866 a law was passed creating Probate Courts in some 28 counties and Ralls was one. At the election in that year Nathan S. Dimmitt was elected Judge of Probate for 4 years. In 1870 John Megown was elected and still holds the office. (It was Judge John Megown who compiled the early sketch in the 1878 Atlas, from which I have taken the list of county officers and description of the early townships. NDN).

- No. 2 - Nathan S. Dimmitt
- No. 3 - Christy Gentry, Jr.
- No. 4 - James W. Lear

In 1859 James R. Tutt and Nathan S. Dimmitt were re-elected and Robert Kendrick appointed Assessor for #3, and Samuel H. Whiteman for # 4.

The Districts were abolished in 1860 and Nathan S. Dimmitt assessed the whole county in that year.

County Treasurers

The Clerk of the County Court was Treasurer until 1826, Stephen Glascock was therefore the Treasurer up to that date.

February 1826 the County Court appointed Asa Glascock.

February 1833, Abel M. Conner was appointed but resigned in November and Henry A. Harris was appointed.

February 1838, Thomas J. Rhodes.

March 1837, Alexander McMurtry

February 1842, Thos. J. Rhodes was appointed.

In March 1844 Hanceford Brown was appointed and held the office until 1862 when George Campbell Hays, Jr., was elected to the position.

In 1864, Samuel C. McCune was elected.

In 1866, George Campbell Hays, Jr., was again elected and was re-elected biennially until 1876. (G.C. Hays, Jr., is the grandfather of WDN.)

In 1876 Edgar H. Halls was elected and still held the office in 1878.

County Surveyors

The County Surveyors were: Thomas Marlin; Samuel K. Caldwell; John Chitwood; Corgin West; James G. Wylie; John B. Brooks and Jeremiah B. Vardeman the surveyor in 1878.

Deeds

The first record in Deed Book A, Halls County, Missouri is - the "Commission" of Stephen Glascock Esquire as Clerk of the Circuit Court, signed by A. McNair, then the Governor of Missouri; this dated 26 Dec. 1820.

The first deed of record is that of Henry Jones of the town of St. Louis to William Jones of aforesaid place a lot in the Town of Wacanda in the county of (cont'd p 11)

Ralls State of Missouri known on the plan of the Town as No. 336...for \$150 - - to make a warranty deed as soon as the proprietors of said Town shall obtain from the United States a patent for the same. Jan 22, 1821.

(This may be the town Wyaconda in Lewis Co., which was laid out and gave promise of being a thriving town but in a short time became obsolete." See N.E. Mo., Hist. Vol 1/379. NDN).

First Marriages

The first marriage recorded in Book A of Ralls County Marriage Records (now in the office of the Recorder, New London, Ralls County, Mo.) is:

One page of "Business References" - New London, Saverton, Perry, Center and Miscellaneous.

Several pages showing pictures of various homes, individuals, the Ralls County Court House and jail, maps of the U.S., State of Missouri, the County, Towns and others showing Township, Range, Section, giving schools, churches and land owners.

The chart of the town of New London showed the following buildings: Christian, Baptist and Catholic Churches and one "Colored" Church; public school, Court House, Jail; P.O., Hays Hotel (which was run by U.C. Hays, son of George C. Hays, Sr.); New London Hotel (run by Mrs. Ellen Smith); a Bank and a Wagon shop. The wagon shop was where our Bank now (1944) stands; the then Bank being across the street from the Court House at about where the Farm Bureau Service Store (1944) stands, Lot 80 in Block 22. The Hays Hotel, afterwards called the "Century Inn" and which burned about two years ago, adjoined the Post Office which was on the corner lot 181, Block 38; The New London Hotel was where the old brick now stands - the churches, jail, Court House and School - all, in their present location.

The Corporate limits of the town were West Street, First Street on the North, Depot Street on the East and 7th Street on the South; Block 6 (Public Spring), block 25, block 48 and block 41 making the four town corner blocks. The town had grown since its incorporation in 1837 - see next page.

(Probate Office - Book, July 1821 - August 1837, on page 383 gives:

Petition for incorporation of Town Commissioners

NW corner of said Town near Lot 12 Block 6S8 degrees E with the line of said Town SW corner lot 257 in Block 41 thence E 8 degrees N with the line of said town to near the SE corner of Lot 280 in Block 40 thence N 8 degrees aforesaid to near NE corner Lot 1 Block 1 thence W 8 degrees S with the line of said town to the beginning.

Court ordered that part of New London as above described to be incorporated and to be known and styled "The Inhabitants of the Town of New London."

Trustees appointed were:

- Richard S. Howard
- Granville Clayton
- Hansford Brown
- Simon Davis
- Jeptha S. Crosthwait

Feb. 10, 1835."

According to this old Atlas, the town of New London was laid out by William Jameson in 1819.

The first road North of Salt river, was the earth road from New London, Ralls County, to Hannibal, located shortly after 1818, when the sectionalizing surveys were made by the government engineer. (N.E. Mo. Hist. Vol 1 1/84).

Foreword

The names of these early settlers, with date and place of nativity, date of migration to Ralls County, Missouri, etc., have been obtained from various sources. (see Bibliography).

No attempt has been made to list all dates nor to give the names of all children of these settlers, it being the purpose of the compiler to collect in one volume - in so far as possible - names of pioneer families, thus giving the researcher in family history a clue to where information may be obtained.

In many cases these names will not be in the index of the particular volume quoted, but will be found under the name of a family into which a daughter married. When additional data is given it is in parenthesis followed by the initials "N.D.N."

An alphabetical index will be found on pages 128 to 138 inclusive; however, this is not a complete index as to persons, although a complete index to family names. In nearly all cases the name listed is that of the pioneer; no attempt has been made to include the children in this index except in a few instances.

You are under a mistake about my children all being
married. I have three single children yet, two sons and
a daughter. Lewis, Martha and Stephen Harvey, he is
the youngest, he will be 14 years old in December.

I have a prospect of a very good crop this year. I
have nine acres of very good wheat and seven acres of
oats and I have stock of every kind, to do me very well.
Sister Prudence wrote me a letter this spring. I have
not heard from her since. You wish to have my children
and grandchildren's names.

William Casey has had nine children. Loucetta-Rebecca-
William-James-Columbus-George Washington-Samuel-
Thomas Jefferson- and Benjamine Franklin died when a baby.

Mary Green has seven she calls them James Walton-
Robert Franklin-Harriet Ann-Henry Fletcher-Charles-
Mary Ellen and they talk of calling their baby William.

James Monroe has two, he calls them Martha Ann and
William Carrol.

Harriet Sitton has five, she calls them William Andrew-
James Lawrence-Elbrige Jerry-Thomas Lilburn-Martha Ann.

Benjamine Franklin has three, he calls them James Andrew-

p 240 - JAMES D. BIGGS, was born in Ralls County, Mo. Oct. 17, 1843. - a great grandson of Davis Biggs, pioneer preacher of Northeast Missouri.

(while the Rev. Davis Biggs never lived in Ralls County, many descendants did and are still living here, and the compiler feels this record should be included in the Early Settlers list of Ralls County. NDN.)

p 216-19-- DAVIS BIGGS was born in Camden Co. N.C., March 8, 1763. His father, John Biggs was of Welsh extraction and emigrated from England many years before the Revolution, and he was a soldier in the War of 1776. (See D.A.R. Record, below, NDN). John Biggs and his wife had 3 sons besides Davis; Robert, the eldest, John and Imorish. The father died when Davis was but a boy. At the age of 18 Davis Biggs married Anna Morris (dau. of Jesse Morris of Camden Co. N.C.) and had 2 sons, William & Morris, and 2 daughters. The family went from N.C. to Virginia, thence to Kentucky in 1810 where Davis Biggs settled in Bourbon Co. (It was here his son William Biggs married Elizabeth McCune, the dau. of John McCune, and the granddaughter of the Rev. soldier William McCune, and also John Shannon. NDN).

In September 1820, Davis Biggs and family landed on Peno Creek in Pike Co. Mo. He died on Aug 1, 1845 being "upwards of 82 years of age." (He is buried in the old Grassy Creek Burying Ground, originally on "Reading" land in Pike Co., his stone still standing in Sept. 1944 (NDN.)

D.A.R. Lineage Bk. 100; p 234 gives the Revolutionary Record of John Biggs (born 1727; died 1778) served as a Private, N.C. Reg't; born in England; died in N.C. Married 1760 Rebecca _____, and had Davis Biggs in 1763 who died in 1845; he married 1781 Anna Morris and had William Biggs born in 1783 (d. 1847) who married in 1809 Elizabeth McCune (1795-1878) and had John Davis Biggs born in 1811; died 1889, who married 2nd Harriet Bentley (1820-1875) in 1837, and had Emily Biggs in 1853 who in 1874 m. as his third wife, James Marshall Smith.

He aided in the organization of the 1st Baptist church in New London in 1823 or 1824. He was a member of the convention of Booneville in 1850 to locate William Jewell College. He died at his home in Palmyra, Nov. 3, 1873. (Palmyra, Marion Co. NDN).

In 1831 the family emigrated to Missouri and settled in Marion County, north of the Fabius, young John having come out and raised a crop the year before. Soon after landing here he lost his father; on Mar 29, 1831, he married Mary Lake. In 1841 he was ordained a Baptist Minister. He was pastor of Salem and Bethel Churches, Ralls Co. and died Jan. 11, 1878 in Ralls County.

John Vardeman Sr., emigrated to America from Sweden and settled in S.C. early in the 18th century when John Vardeman Jr. was 7 years old. Here John Vardeman, Jr. grew to manhood and married Elizabeth Morgan, a native of Wales, and soon after removed and settled in Bedford Co. In 1767 they removed to the settlement on the New River, and in 1779 to Kentucky and settled near Crab Orchard. John 2 Vardeman and Elizabeth (Morgan) Vardeman had 12 children, the youngest being Jeremiah Vardeman who was born 12 miles above old Fort Chiswell in what is now Wythe County, Virginia, July 8, 1775 - went with his parents and family to Kentucky.

In 1830 Jeremiah Vardeman emigrated to Missouri and settled near Salt River in Ralls County.

Jeremiah Vardeman died Sat. morning, May 28, 1842 in the 67th year of his age. He married 3 times; two sons by his 1st (sic. NDN) wife have long lived in Mo., Jeremiah B. Vardeman and Rev. W.H. Vardeman.

(Jeremiah Vardeman left a will in Bk. B- pgs 52-3-4; letters were granted June 6, 1842. Estate papers are in file box 1183 in the office of Probate Judge, Harry G. Weaver, New London, Ralls Co. Mo.)

William H. Vardeman was the tenth child of Jeremiah Vardeman and Elizabeth his wife, and was born near David's Fork Baptist meeting house, Fayette Co. Ky., June 28, 1816. At the age of 2 he was left motherless; hence his training was left mainly to his step-mother, the third (sic, NDN) wife of his father, Miss Lucy Bullock, of Woodford, Ky.

In 1830 when he was 14 his father removed to Ralls County, 6 miles west of New London the county seat. Here he completed his majority, and by the assistance of BUTLER W. BROWN, a celebrated schoolteacher from Ky. he acquired a good education, etc. etc. -

(See section "A" -- CASPER HARDY - Pension paper of Arnold Hardy, father of Casper, dated Sept. 5, 1842 which states Butler W. Brown is a resident of Ralls Co., Butler W. Brown died int. in 1846. NDN.)
